

Abraham Lincoln (1861-1865)



Abraham Lincoln was the 16th president of the United States of America. He was born in 1809 and was 51 when he took office in 1860, right before the start of the Civil War in 1861. During his time as president, he signed the Emancipation Proclamation and gave his famous Gettysburg Address. He was re-elected in 1864 but was unfortunately assassinated by John Wilkes Booth, only one year later in 1865.

James A. Garfield (1881-1881)



James A. Garfield was the 20th President of the United States. He started his presidency in March of 1881 and died in September of the same year. He was shot by an angry attorney in a Washington railroad station in July. He spent months trying to survive his wounds but ended up dying in September from infection and hemorrhage.



John F. Kennedy served as the 35th president of the United States from 1961 to 1963. In 1963, he called on Congress to pass a civil rights bill desegregating restaurants, hotels, schools, and more. He was assassinated in Dallas on November 22, 1963, while in his motorcade. The attempt was recorded on television and many conspiracy theories have abounded from the incident.

We drew materials from the digital libraries of the Smithsonian, the Library of Congress, the National Archives, and six other websites.

This digital library was created to celebrate the history and achievements of the United States Presidents and to inspire a wide variety of users from diverse backgrounds to learn and appreciate American presidential history. We also hope that his library may inspire patriotism in current and future United States citizens.

We did not use the Contributor, Relation, or Coverage $metadata\ fields\ for\ most\ of\ the\ items,\ as\ these\ fields\ did\ not\ seem\ to\ apply\ to\ our\ file\ choices.\ When\ there\ was\ no\ date\ of\ publication\ listed$ for a website, we input the date the website was originally accessed.
