A rewording of something written or spoken by someone else.

To do this, use these strategies:

- 1. Use no more than 3 words in a row
- 2. Use synonyms
- 3. Change the sentence structure

# Reading Question 1

The first step when reading an article is to look at titles/subheadings, the length of the text, paragraph sections, and the first sentence of each paragraph.

In this step, you should not stop to look up vocabulary; just continue without stopping.

# Reading Question 3

Underlining, highlighting, writing cues, and short phrases in the text to help you study in the future.

You should do this periodically and NOT just before a test. The notes in the margins will help you do this.

# Listening Question 1
